Victoria Scones

INGREDIENTS

8oz Self Raising flour

Pinch of Salt

2oz Margarine

2oz Castor Sugar

- 1 Medium Egg, beaten with milk to make ¼ pint liquid
- 8 Glace Cherries
- 1. Heat oven to 200C, 400F, Gas Mark 6 and grease a baking tray
- 2. Mix flour and salt, rub in fat
- 3. Stir in sugar and mix to a soft dough with the egg and milk reserving a little to brush the tops
- 4. Knead lightly on a floured board and divide into four
- 5. Roll each piece to a round just over 1cm (1/2 inch) in thickness and place on the baking tray. Cut across the top to mark each into four.
- 6. Brush with egg and milk and place half a cherry on each quarter. Bake for about 10 15 mins.
