4. Each Article to be accompanied by a card securely attached with Competitor's Name, Address and Institute (if a member) enclosed in an envelope, bearing Section number and Class number on each entry.

5. Every care will be taken of Exhibits, but the Committee do not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage.

6. Entry Fee – Up to 5 items £1, Over 5 items £2. **PLEASE NOTE:** Cash only with entries

PLEASE NOTE: S.W.I. members please give entry money to Institute delegate, if possible. This will be of great assistance at the Show.

PLEASE NOTE: Entry Fee for Communal Section VII is £1 and items must be made by 3 or more members.
