## Lemon Oat Bars

For the Crumble:

160g plain flour  
100g porridge oats  
110g light brown sugar  
136g unsalted butter  
¼ tsp bicarbonate of soda  
¼ tsp salt

For the Filling:

1 x 397g tin of condensed milk  
3 lemons, zested and juiced

### METHOD

Make the crumble by mixing the flour, oats, butter, sugar, bicarbonate of soda and salt in a food processor until just combined or rub in by hand. Tip half of the crumble into the baking tin (a 20cm square deep baking tin lined so it comes up two sides of tin for easy removal once baked) then press down firmly and bake at 190C / 375F / Gas mark 5 for 10 minutes until golden and set.

Make the filling by mixing the condensed milk with the lemon zest and lemon juice until thickened. Spread the filling over the baked base.

Carefully sprinkle over the remaining crumble and press down lightly. Bake for a further 20 minutes until the edges are golden brown and the centre is set but soft. Leave to cool completely before removing from the tin and cutting into four rows by three rows.
