5. Every care will be taken of Exhibits, but the Committee do not hold themselves responsible for any loss or damage.

6. Entry Fee – Up to 5 items £1, Over 5 items £2. **PLEASE NOTE:** Cash only with entries

Tartan Scones

1lb self raising flour
2oz butter
8oz mature cheddar (grated)
4oz feta cheese (chopped)
1 egg (beaten with 10oz milk)
2 rounded tsp baking powder
4 spring onions (finely chopped)
¼ red bell pepper (finely chopped)
1 medium de-seeded tomato (chopped)
Salt and Pepper
Pinch of chilli powder
Pinch of paprika

METHOD

Pre-heat oven to 220°C/gas mark 7 and prepare a baking sheet.

Sieve together flour, paprika, chilli, baking powder and salt and pepper.

Rub in the butter and cheese and lightly mix in feta, spring onion, tomato and pepper.

Stir in milk and eggs and bind to give a fairly soft dough.

Gently roll or pat out to ¾” thickness using a 2 ½” cutter.

Put on a greased baking sheet and bake for about 10 minutes until golden brown and well risen.

Transfer onto wire rack to cool.
