### CARNATION LOAF

8 ozs. Margarine.  
 8 ozs. Castor Sugar.  
 1 lb. Mixed Fruit.  
 4 ozs. Cherries.  
 Small Tin Carnation Milk.  
 2 Eggs  
 5 ozs. Self-Raising Flour.  
 5 ozs. Plain Flour.

Cream margarine and sugar. Stir in fruit and eggs with a little flour at a time. Mixture will be quite stiff at this stage. Gradually add milk and rest of flour and mix well. Divide mixture between two 1 lb. size loaf tins and bake for 1½ - 1¾ hours at 170°C.

Store for two weeks before using.

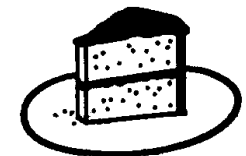
